Dinners will cost £2.20 per day which can be paid daily, weekly, half termly or termly.

Reducing absence is a key priority nationally and locally because missing school damages your child's attainment, disrupts school routines and the learning of others and can leave a pupil vulnerable to anti-social behaviour and crime. Above all, missing school seriously affects your child's longer term life opportunities.

Reasons for issuing penalty notices

Penalty notices may be used to tackle unauthorised absence in the following circumstances:

- Where the parent has chosen to take their child on holiday during term time without authorisation, especially where the absence will lead to the child missing a public examination i.e. SATs and GCSEs.
- In cases where pupils are persistently late for school after the register has been closed.
- In cases where a pupil's parents fail to work with the school and the Education Welfare Service to improve attendance. If your child has at least 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absences within 100 sessions (10 weeks), then you could be liable for receiving a penalty notice.






World Book Day ~ Thursday7th March



As you know Scamp has made a few visits to school to share reading with the pupils. The pupils love this, although they find his occasional snoring during their reading a little rude!

Recently Mrs Blackie and I have been fortunate enough to be part of "Trauma Informed Schools" training , which is being offered free to all Cornish Schools as part of mental health awareness. This is the best training I have ever been on. A small part of it has been verifying the science behind working alongside animals and nature, how they calm the heartrate, regulate brain chemicals etc. Children working alongside nature and animals is something I have always felt passionate about. With this in mind I registered Scamp as a Therapy Pet. He passed his assessment with flying colours so he can now come to school to provide comfort, calm and a listening ear (selectively!) to pupils.

At his age of 14 he won't be in everyday as he does get tired. If you would prefer your child not to have any contact with Scamp please let me know.
