Parent Trustee Election

The closing date for nominations for our Parent Trustee vacancy passed on 31 January 2019. Three nominations have been received and as there is only one vacancy currently available, a confidential ballot must now take place. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes will be appointed as parent trustee for a four-year term.

Each parent or carer with a child attending a school within The Roseland Multi Academy Trust is entitled to one vote regardless of the number of children they have in school. Your ballot paper should be returned to any of the school offices by 12.00pm on Wednesday 13 February 2019. Please note the double envelope system explained within the voting instructions. This system is in place to ensure the anonymity of your vote. Votes cast not using the double envelope system will not be counted. Printed ballot papers and blank envelopes are also available at each school's reception desk.

Each candidate has been asked to provide a statement in support of their nomination, which are attached to this letter. Please remember that you are voting for the person that you consider has the skills and experience to undertake the role successfully – it does not matter if you do not personally know the candidate.

Parent Trustee ballot paper

To ensure a transparent and smooth election process please adhere to the following:

- Only mark one box,
- Make your selection by marking the candidate of your choice with a 'X',
- Only provide one vote per parent or carer, regardless of the number of children registered at the MAT schools. Each parent is entitled to one vote,
- If your ballot paper is spoiled please complete a new one,
- You may deliver the completed ballot paper personally to any TRMAT school or send it by post to ensure that it is received at the school by **12.00 NOON on Wednesday 13 February 2019**,
- Each ballot paper, however returned to the school, should be in a plain sealed envelope, which in turn is inside a sealed envelope. The outer envelope must have your child's name on it. This double envelope system is necessary so that those voting can then be checked against the school register as a way of ensuring that only those entitled to take part in the ballot actually do so and the ballot remains secret. Any ballot papers submitted not using this system will be void,
- Ballot papers recording more than the required votes or marked in any other way will be invalid and not included in the final count.

I am a parent of a young person attending Treviglas and can bring to the post of Parent Trustee many years experience in finance and budgeting along with project management.

My son has significant additional needs and this has necessitated fostering a close relationship with everyone involved in his care and education. I run a charity that supports disabled children in Cornwall and have significant experience supporting children and young people with additional needs. My eldest son is currently studying for his A levels and we are supporting him in his choices for further education, so I have a broad experience of both special needs and high achieving children and the challenge both present me with.

I have experience of being on a board of Governors, at Trenance Infant school and for a short time at Treviglas until we went into special measures.

As a management accountant I have many years experience in managing finances, auditing and supporting other board members to understand the key points of financial reporting. I was the data governor at Trenance and was getting to grips with the data at Treviglas just before the governing body was disbanded. I believe using the data to drive improvement is a key component of being a trustee.
