### What is an App?

An App is a small, specialised software programme which can be downloaded to a mobile device to carry out a particular function.

Why are Apps so popular with young people? Young people love to personalise their own devices by downloading 'apps' which carry out fun and useful functions from looking up the weather forecast, playing games to sharing photos on a social networking site!

#### Some of the risks

- Ignoring age restrictions
- Sharing personal information/images
- Communicating with people they don't know
- Playing games online with people they don't know

Messenger lets users text, voice-message, send video or photos instantly, or call contacts from their mobile devices. Users can sign up for Messenger without a Facebook account.

Age Recommendation 16+


