Treviglas Academy's improvement journey is the result of all staff at Treviglas Academy working hard together to ensure rapid improvements in all aspects of school life. We are very proud of the work they have done. The Roseland Academy has once more achieved an astounding Progress8 score, once again ranking it as a top performing school in the South West. These results complement our primary school results; outcomes exceeding national average in many areas of Key Stage 2 SATs at Tregony Community Primary School, and at EYFS and Year 1 for Gerrans Primary School. We are all very proud of our achievements and we wish to thank all the students, parents/carers, staff and Trustees for your continued support.

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Mr Challis has been spending more time recently at Treviglas Academy and we are pleased to report that the children are looking very smart in their uniform and are embracing the Trust culture and ethos. The extensive refurbishment plans are ongoing and regular meetings to finalise the details and timescales of works continues. It will be a very exciting time for the school but there will be levels of disruption as well. We will keep everyone informed about the developments and changes and we will need to work hard together to ensure that the classroom experiences of students remain consistently good. We have now received planning permission for the new classrooms to replace the very old and dated Elliot huts which predominantly house the English department. This is great news and will significantly improve the conditions for learning for students and staff.

Staff across the Trust have been collaborating with curricular projects and have enjoyed joint CPD. The main focus has been on the development of our curriculums to ensure the best learning journeys for our students and therefore successful outcomes for them. Working closely across the schools in the Trust is exciting and conducive to creating the best teaching and learning experiences. We are looking forward to future joint projects in many subject areas and subject leads and teachers are working and supporting each other.

We are excited to inform you that the Trust Board is exploring the potential expansion of the Trust and is currently in liaison with the Regional Schools' Commissioner for the South West and Falmouth Multi Academy Trust. Careful consideration and due process is being given to this decision. The Trust Board recognises that the approach in the current Trust is extremely successful, and that other communities and students should benefit. We will keep you updated on any progress.
